Project leader **Dr. Laurel Schaider of Silent Spring Institute** and **Dr. Phil Brown of Northeastern University** will describe a new study in which researchers will be evaluating immune system effects in children (ages 4 to 6) who may have been exposed to PFAS-contaminated drinking water while attending daycare at the Pease Tradeport or whose mothers may have been exposed during pregnancy or while breastfeeding. PFAS-REACH is a five-year project funded by the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences.
